## AN ACT

For the relief of Bargy and Henry, contractors on the Juniata Division of the Pennsylvania Canal.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to examine the claim of Bargy and Henry for damages which they allege they have sustained by pulling down and building up again lock number twenty-eight on the Juniata Division of the Pennsylvania canal, if upon examination it shall appear the said lock had been built according to contract when first constructed, and the said commissioners taking into view the nature of the contract, the sufficiency of the work, and the conduct of the engineers who had the same in charge, shall assess such damages (if any) as the said Bargy and Henry have sustained, which shall be paid by the said commissioners out of the monies appropriated for canal and rail-road purposes: *Provided;* The amount thereof shall not exceed six hundred dollars.

## AN ACT

For the relief of David Leech.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to allow to David Leech, of Arm-

strong county, such damage, if any, that he has sustained by the injury done to his mill, in consequence of the erection of the new dam at Leechburg, on the Western division of the Pennsylvania canal; and the said David Leech may appeal to the board of appraisers of damages, in like manner as appeals are made in other cases: *Provided*, Nothing herein contained shall be construed to entitle the said David Leech to damages for the loss of water power by the destruction of the old dam, but the same shall be considered as if no such water power had existed.

AN ACT

For the relief of Henry Harmonie and David Wolf, late supervisors of Fannett township, in the county of Franklin,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That on the application of Henry Harmonie and David Wolf, formerly supervisors of the township of Fannett, in the county of Franklin, to the auditors of said township, they are hereby authorized and required to re-examine the accounts of the aforesaid Henry Harmonie and David Wolf, and if it shall appear that there is a balance in their favour it shall be the duty of said auditors or a majority of them to draw their order in favour of the aforesaid Henry Harmonie and David Wolf for such sum as shall appear due to them on the supervisors of the aforesaid township, which sum they are hereby authorized and required to collect and pay the same to the aforesaid Henry Harmonie and David Wolf.
