AN ACT

To annul the marriage contracts of John Welding and Ann his wife, and Lewis Rineheart and Sarah his wife.

Divorce of
John Weld-
ing and wife.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into between John Welding and Ann his wife, now or late of the county of Northampton, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract, and from all the duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, effectually and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the marriage contract entered into by and between Lewis Rineheart and Sarah his wife, late Sarah Wall, both late of the county of Luzerne, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract, and from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, and effectually, and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage.

AN ACT

Vesting the right and title of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania to a certain tract of land in the Reformed and Lutheran Congregation of the township of Lehigh, in the county of Northampton.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to the legislature that in pursuance of an application dated the eleventh day of November, one thousand seven hundred and sixty-seven, number two thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, there

were surveyed to George Wannemaker and John Dorn, trustees of the Reformed and Lutheran Congregation aforesaid, in trust for the use of said congregation, a certain tract of land in Lehigh township, Northampton county, containing seven acres and allowance, which said tract of land hath ever since been used and occupied by the said congregation for the purposes of public worship, but hath never been patented, and the legislature being now willing to favour the request of the said congregation in that behalf: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the right, title and claim of the common-

wealth of Pennsylvania in and to a certain tract of land situate in Lehigh township, Northampton county, adjoining lands surveyed to Daniel Brown, the Indian tract, and others, containing seven acres and allowance, surveyed to the Reformed and Lutheran congregation of said township, in pursuance of an application, dated the eleventh day of November, one thousand seven hundred and sixty-seven, number two thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby vested in Conrad Newhart and George Wentz, trustees of the said congregation and their successors, in trust for the sole use and benefit of said congregation forever, and the Secretary of the Land Office is hereby authorized and required, immediately after the passage of this act, upon application being made to him for that purpose, to issue a patent to the said trustees for the tract of land aforesaid, without fee or reward: *Provided always,* That in case of the said Reformed and Lutheran congregation should at any time hereafter be dissolved or cease to occupy the said tract of land for the purpose of public worship, or should sell and dispose of the same, that then all the rights and privileges hereby granted shall revert to and vest in the commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
