

SECT. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in addition to the customary professorships in other colleges, there shall be in this institution a German Professorship established, the incumbent of which shall, in addition to such other duties as may be assigned him by the Board, instruct such young men as may resort to the institution for the purpose of becoming qualified to be teachers of those primary schools, in which, according to the act passed last session, both German and English are to be taught; that if, at any time, said corporation shall misuse or abuse any of the privileges hereby granted, the legislature may resume all and singular the rights and privileges hereby granted to said corporation.

SECT. 12. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, the Clearfield academy, in the town of Clearfield, and Curwenville academy or school house, in the town of Curwenville, the lot or lots on which the same is erected, and all other lots and lands belonging to the said academies, situate in Clearfield county, shall be exempted from taxation, and shall not hereafter be subject to the assessment of any state, county or other tax, so long as such lots, lands and buildings shall be owned and held by said academies.

SECT. 13. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That nothing in this act contained shall interfere with or prevent the collection of any taxes heretofore laid or assessed on said lots, lands or buildings belonging to the said academies.

AN ACT

To authorize certain alterations in the charter of the United Hebrew Beneficent Society of Philadelphia.

WHEREAS, the United Hebrew Beneficent Society of Philadelphia has been incorporated for the purpose of relieving

poor Israelites, educating poor children, and binding them apprentices to learn mechanical trades, ministering to the sick and burying the indigent dead: *And whereas*, under present circumstances, its sphere of usefulness is greatly circumscribed by a requisition in its charter that applicants for membership shall reside within this commonwealth and shall apply in writing: *And whereas*, a large majority of the members of the society have petitioned for such alterations in their charter as in their opinion the general assembly alone can grant: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the United Hebrew Beneficent Society of Philadelphia shall have the power to elect, as its members, individuals residing out of the state, in the same manner as other members may be elected, according to the provisions of the charter of the said society.

Society may elect members out of the state.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That from and after the passing of this act, any member of the said society may propose another for membership, and that a written application shall not be indispensably necessary.

Written application for membership may be dispensed with.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That so much of any portion of the charter of the said society as is inconsistent with the foregoing provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed, annulled and made void.
