

and designating the person or persons to whom such damage is done and payable, and if a sufficient number do not meet to act, or if they cannot agree, the court may at any time appoint others; the said viewers shall make report to the said court, and if approved by the court, said report shall be entered of record, and the said alley from the Diamond to Fifth-street aforesaid, shall thenceforth be deemed and taken to be a lawful public alley, and shall be called "Market alley." Report and confirmation.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That as soon as the costs and damages so assessed shall be paid unto the persons in whose favor the same shall be awarded, or into said court by any individual or individuals, the prothonotary shall so certify to the court, and the court shall order said alley to be opened. Upon certificate of payment of damages alley to be opened.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the costs shall be regulated as the costs of similar proceedings under the laws for laying out, making and repairing roads in this commonwealth. Costs of proceedings.

AN ACT

Authorizing the guardians of the minor children of John Wills, late of Allegheny county, deceased, to join in the sale and conveyance of certain lands in Allegheny and Butler counties, which were held by the said John Wills in his life time, and Alexander Wills of Cumberland county, as tenants in common.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John Hannen and Hugh Davis, guardians of the minor children of John Wills, late of Allegheny county, deceased, are hereby authorized to join in the sale either

public or private with Alexander Wills, of Cumberland county, of the following real estate, to wit: a tract of land situate in Ross township, Allegheny county, bounded by lands of Cecil's heirs, Henry Cable, John Morrow and others, containing about one hundred and eighteen acres, also a tract of land situate in Cranberry township, Butler county, containing about one hundred and ninety-six acres, and to join with the said Alexander Wills, in the execution of such deed or deeds of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, in fee simple for such title and estate, as the said John Wills, had and held therein, at and immediately before his death: *Provided however*, That before any deed or deeds of conveyance shall be executed by the said guardians, the Orphans' court of Allegheny county, shall approve of the terms and conditions of the said sale or sales, and the said guardians shall also give sufficient surety for the faithful appropriation of the proceeds thereof, according to law, to be approved by the Orphans' court aforesaid.

AN ACT

For the relief of Archibald Shaw, John Jacobs, John Myers and Gideon Long, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Jacobs, of York county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.
