

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Archibald Shaw, of Baltimore county, state of Maryland, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. Same to A. Shaw.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Myers, of Perry county, or to his order, forty dollars, as a gratuity for his revolutionary services. \$40 grat. to John Myers.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Gideon Long, of Greene county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. \$40 grat and ann. to G. Long.

AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract between James Welsh and Catharine Louisa,
his wife.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into in the city Philadelphia: of Philadelphia, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, between James Welsh, formerly of the island of Jamaica, and Catharine Louisa Livingston, also formerly of the same place, be, and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released, set free and discharged

from the said marriage contract, and from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully and effectually and absolutely, as if they never had been joined in the bonds of matrimony.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled An act for the establishment of a college at Easton in the county of Northampton, passed the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful to and for the trustees of La Fayette college, if they shall deem it advisable to dispense with the maintenance and observance of military discipline, and with the teaching of military science and tactics, and civil and military engineering at the said institution as required by the act, to which this is a supplement.

Military education may be dispensed with.
