SECT. 64. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That section forty-one of the act approved the sixth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, concerning election districts, is hereby repealed, and any of the inhabitants who were entitled to vote at Bloomfield by virtue of said section, and who are not included in the township of Centre, shall hereafter vote in the districts to which they respectively belonged before the passage of the said section.

SECT. 65. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the (electors) of Venango township, in the county of Crawford, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John M'Fadden, in the village of Cambridge, in said township.

SECT. 66. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors in the township of Salt Lick, in the county of Fayette, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the housenow occupied by James Rogers, in said township.

SECT. 67. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of the township of Catawissa, in the county of Columbia, which has lately been set off into a separate township, to be called Roaring Creek, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John Yeager, in the said township of Roaring creek.

SECT. 68. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors in the township of Washington, in the county of York, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of James Marshall, now occupied by David Shultz, in said township.

SECT. 69. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of part of Manheim township, in the county of Schuylkill, lying south east of the following line; commencing at the township line of Wayne and Manheim townships, on the Summer Hill; thence along the Summer Hill and Orwigsburg road. to the house of widow Schweicker and the house of John Dewald, excluding the same; thence to the house of Philip Drumheller; thence to the house of John Deibert, at the centre turnpike; thence to the house of John Batz; thence to the house of Philip Koch; thence to the house belonging to John Shoener, Junior, including the same; thence to the township line of said Manheim and Schuylkill townships, shall hereafter hold

their general elections at the court house in the borough of Orwigsburg, in said county.
