SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby required to pay to John Ewing, of Huntingdon county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars as a gratuity for his revolutionary services, and that so much of the act passed the twenty-fourth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, entitled "An act for the relief of James Ewing, James Seals and Thomas Abbott, soldiers of the revolutionary war," as grants a gratuity to James Ewing of Huntingdon county, be and the same is hereby repealed. A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act-entitled "An act for the regulation of the militia of this Commonwealth."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Adjutant General is hereby authorized to purchase two hundred copies of cavalry tactics, the expense of which shall not exceed two dollars per copy, to be distributed to each troop. uted so as to allow to the commanding officer of each troop one copy, the expense to be paid to his order on the state treasurer, in the usual way.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each company of Riflemen shall be allowed two dollars per day for music, on stated days of training, to be paid by the proper Brigade Inspector as other musicians are paid, by the act to which this is supplementary.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Brigade Inspector of the second brigade of the sixteenth division, is hereby required to organize the Erie Light Artillery company in said brigade, if he shall find that the members are uniformed and equipped according to the provisions of the thirty-second section of the act to which this is a further supplement, any thing in the said act to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the militia residing in the townships of Oil Creek, Troy, Athens, Rome, Sparta and Bloomfield, in the county of Crawford, and the townships of Concord, Union and Venango, in the county of Erie (or so much of the one hundred and fourth regiment as was included within the fourth and sixth companies thereof) be, and they are hereby erected into a separate battalion, to be called "The Oil Creek Union Militia Battalion," subject to all the provisions of the act to which this is a further supplement.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That where troops of cavalry are so situated that three troops cannot be conveniently formed into a battalion, any two troops, consisting of one hundred men, may be formed into a battalion, and elect one major, one adjutant, one quarter-master and one surgeon.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each company and troop of regularly organized volunteers, shall be entitled to tents and other camp equipage, in the proportion of one tent and the necessary equipage, now in the several arsenals of the state, to every three officers, and the same to every six men, to be drawn under the same regulations as are prescribed by the act to which this is a further supplement, for furnishing arms and accoutrements: *Provided,* That not more than a proper proportion shall be allowed to any brigade, if the volunteers of other brigades shall apply for the same, and in all cases, the senior companies in each brigade shall have preference, but no tents shall be given except where a regiment or battalion shall agree to do camp duty, at least three days in succession in each year.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Adjutant General shall not hereafter issue

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the enrolled militia and volunteers attached to the seventeenth regiment, first brigade, ninth division, Pennsylvania militia, residing within the following bounds, shall hereafter compose a separate battalion, any thing in any former law, to the contrary notwithstanding, that is to say, the townships of Washington and Clinton, except that part of the latter north of the Bald Eagle mountain, and west of the Loyalsock Gap: *Provided*, That if at any time hereafter it shall be found necessary to attach said battalion to any other battalion, so as to form a new regiment, it shall be done in the manner prescribed by the sixth section of the act to which this is a further supplement: *And provided further*, That the enrolled militia and volunteers of the battalion aforesaid, shall be entitled to elect one major, one adjutant, and one quarter master, for said battalion, the first election to be held at such time as may be fixed upon by the proper Brigade Inspector.

SECT. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That so much of the thirty-seventh section of the act to which this is a further supplement, as prescribes that volunteer companies not belonging to any regiment or battalion of volunteers, shall be attached to and train with the militia, on days of regimental or battalion training, be, and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the Du Quesne Greys of the city of Pittsburg.

Du Quesne Greys, Pittsburg, authorized to train independently of militia.

SECT. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the compensation of the keeper of the State Arsenal at Harrisburg, shall, from and after the passage of this act, be one hundred and fifty dollars annually, and that so much of any former law or laws, as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
