## A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act relative to the appointment of canal commissioners," passed the sixth day of April eighteen hundred and thirty.

Canal commissioners to accompany their annual report by statement of tolls, transportation, &c.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That in addition to the duties now enjoined on the canal commissioners by law, it shall be the duty of the said commissioners, at the same time they make their annual report to the Governor, to accompany the same with a statement showing the amount of tolls received by each collector on the Pennsylvania canal and rail-road; also, with a statement or statements showing the amount of property in tons or otherwise, and the kinds thereof, conveyed on said canal and rail-road during the preceding year or season, designating how much and of what kind was conveyed west from Philadelphia and east from Pittsburg, also to and from such other places as they may think proper and expedient; and the board of canal commissioners shall have power; from time to time, to make such rules and regulations not inconsistent with the laws of this state as they may judge reasonable and necessary to carry the foregoing provisions into complete effect.

## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act to regulate fences, and to appoint appraisers in each township in the counties of Northumberland, Westmoreland, Washington and Fayette, and to encourage the raising of swine," passed the twenty-seventh day of March seventeen hundred and eighty four.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the tenth section of "An act to regulate

fences and to appoint appraisers in each township in the counties of Bedford, Northumberland, Westmoreland, Washington and Fayette, and to encourage the raising of swine," passed the twenty-seventh day of March, A. D. seventeen hundred and eighty-four, be and the same is hereby repealed so far as respects the county of Lycoming, and that the several acts repealed in said section be and the same are hereby renewed, so far as they are applicable to the county of Lycoming.

AN ACT

For the relief of Sebastian Koch, Thomas M'Kleroy, James Denny, Isaac Cowell and Adam Pope, soldiers of the revolutionary war, and Elizabeth Clindienst and Susan Mosher, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Sebastian Koch of Berks county, Thomas M'Kleroy of Fayette county, and Adam Pope of York county, or to their respective orders, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.
