

Contingent vacation of portions of Greenwich street and Greenwich point house road.

Southwark commissioners authorized to guarantee to stockholders of Southwark rail-road co. 6 per cent. int. on certain expenditure.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That as soon as, and whenever a certain street in the district of Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia, called Church street, and marked on the public plan of the said district, shall be opened as a public street or highway from Franklin street, (which Franklin street is also marked on the said plan, and is now a public street) to the southern boundary of the said district, that then and immediately thereafter, so much of a certain street on said plan marked, called Greenwich street, as lies and is situate between the east side of Delaware Front street, and the north side of the said Franklin street, and so much of a certain road in the said district, called Greenwich Point house road, as lies and is situate between the south side of the said Franklin street, and the southern boundary of the said district of Southwark, shall be and are hereby declared to be vacated as public streets or highways.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the board of commissioners of the district of Southwark be, and they are hereby authorized to guarantee to the stockholders of the Southwark rail road company, the amount of deficit on the interest of the stock, not exceeding six per centum per annum on the amount expended for constructing said rail-road from the corner of Broad and Cedar streets to the river Delaware.

AN ACT

For the relief of Jacob Booz and Eberhart Ohl, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Booz of Montgomery county, or to his order, forty dollars as a gratuity for his revolutionary services.

\$40 gratuity granted to J. Booz.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Eberhart Ohl of Schuylkill county, or to his order forty dollars as a gratuity for his revolutionary services.* Same to E. Ohl. }

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act to incorporate the Reading Academy.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of three thousand dollars is hereby granted to the trustees of the Reading Academy, in the county of Berks, for the relief of said Academy, to be paid by the State Treasurer, on warrant of the Governor: Provided, That the trustees of said Academy shall cause to be educated annually four students, in indigent circumstances, for the term of five years, (if so many shall apply) free of expense of tuition, in such manner as to qualify them for teachers of common English schools.* \$3000 appropriated. Free education of 4 students for 5 years.
