SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the present directors of the said association shall continue to act as such until the second Saturday of May next, at which time, and annually thereafter, the said corporation shall elect a president and such other officers as may be required in the constitution and by-laws of said association, for the proper government thereof.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That all poor children, now entitled by law to be educated at the public expense, and residing within two miles of the said school house, shall, at the option of their parents or guardians, be taught in the said Lancasterian school, and the expense of tuition of each scholar shall not exceed one dollar per quarter, to be paid in the manner prescribed by the act entitled "An act to provide for the education of the poor gratis," passed the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and nine.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Machpelah Cemetery Society of Philadelphia.

Society in-
vested with
the usual cor-
porate pow-

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That all and every the persons who shall, at the time of the passing of this act, be members of the association called the "Machpelah Cemetery Society of Philadelphia," shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title, of

the "Machpelah Cemetery Society of Philadelphia," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value or income of the necessary houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities, or other hereditaments and real estate of the said corporation, and the interest of money by it lent shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars; and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure, and also to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations, as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof: *Provided*, That this act shall continue in force thirty years from the passing thereof, and no longer, for the purposes aforesaid, and the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter, at any time hereafter.
