

the "Machpelah Cemetery Society of Philadelphia," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value or income of the necessary houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities, or other hereditaments and real estate of the said corporation, and the interest of money by it lent shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars; and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure, and also to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations, as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof: *Provided*, That this act shall continue in force thirty years from the passing thereof, and no longer, for the purposes aforesaid, and the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter, at any time hereafter.

To exempt the property of the University of Pennsylvania from taxation.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the real estate of the University of Pennsylva-

AN ACT

To authorize John G. Lowrey and Hamilton Humes, guardians of the minor children of John Miles, deceased, and the administrator of Johnston Frye, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That Hamilton Humes and John G. Lowrey, guardians of Edward, Emeline, Joseph, Green and Elizabeth Miles, minor children of John Miles, late of Boggs township, in the county of Centre, deceased, are hereby authorized to sell at public vendue, at such time and place as may be most suitable and convenient, public notice having been first given in at least one newspaper published in said county, all the right, title, interest, property, claim and demand whatsoever, the said children have, hold, and enjoy, in certain real property in said county, viz: in Centre furnace, with the lands, tenements and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and in "Milesburg forge," with the lands, tenements and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, subject however to the provisions of a certain deed of trust entered into by the said John Miles in his life time, with Joseph Miles, and to the payment out of the proceeds of said sale of any money that may appear to be due to the said Joseph Miles, in carrying into execution the trust reposed in him by the said instrument; and the said guardians are hereby authorized to execute a deed or deeds of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers of said property: *Provided however*, That before
