

Suits must be commenced within 30 days.

within thirty days after such offence shall have been committed: and he or they so offending, shall remain liable to actions, at the suit of the said corporation, for such wrongs, if the said sum or sums herein mentioned be not sufficient to repair and satisfy said damages.

Two years allowed to commence work and five to complete.

SECT. 14. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid* That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on the said work within two years after they shall have been incorporated, or shall not within the space of five years thereafter complete the said bridge, it shall and may be lawful for the legislature of this commonwealth, to resume, all and singular, the rights, liberties and privileges hereby granted to the said company.

Capital stock \$50,000. Corporation precluded from all banking, manufacturing and trading.

SECT. 15. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the capital stock of the said company shall not exceed in amount fifty thousand dollars: and it is hereby provided, that nothing contained in this act shall be considered as in any way giving to the said corporation any banking, manufacturing or trading privileges whatsoever, or any other liberties, privileges or franchises, but such as may be necessary or incident to the building of the said bridge.

AN ACT

For the relief of John Miller and John Bickel administrators of John Kendall, deceased, and for the relief of Michael H. Spangler, Brigade Inspector, the first Brigade, Fifth Division, Pennsylvania Militia, and for other purposes.

Payment of \$396.95 to adm'rs of estate of J. Kendall authorized.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer is hereby directed to pay to John Miller and John Bickel administrators of John Kendall, deceased, late a deputy marshal for the counties of Berks and Schuylkill, three hundred and ninety-six dollars

and ninety-five cents, as compensation for collecting certain militia fines.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer is hereby directed to pay to ^{\$60 to M. H.} Michael H. Spangler, brigade inspector of the first brigade, ^{Spangler.} fifth division, Pennsylvania Militia, the sum of sixty dollars as compensation for settling up the accounts of his predecessor.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the commissioners of Allegheny county, are hereby authorized and required to draw their warrants on the county treasurer, in favor of Ebenezer Kerr, late a coroner of said county, for the amount of jurors, constables and witnesses fees, paid on coroners inquests held by him in said county, at the rate of one dollar per diem for each juror in each case; and the constables and witnesses fees shall be taxed in conformity with the act of the twenty-second February, eighteen hundred and twenty-one, regulating fees before justices of the peace and constables. Comm'rs. of Allegheny co. authorized to pay certain coroner's fees to E. Kerr.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to revive the act incorporating the borough of Greencastle, in the county of Franklin, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, no person or persons who may be elected or appointed to any office, created by the act erecting the town of Greencastle, in the county of Franklin, into a borough, passed the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand Greencastle Franklin co.
