AN ACT

To incorporate "The Asbury Beneficial Society of the City and County of Philadelphia."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons, who shall at the time Corporate
 of the passing of this act, be members of the society, called style.
 "The Asbury Beneficial Society of the city and county of Philadelphia," shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title of "The Asbury Beneficial Society of the city and county of Philadelphia," and by the same name, Privileges and liabilities.
 shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what nature kind or quality soever, real, personal or

- mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value or income of the houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities or other hereditaments, and real estate of the said corporation, and the interest of money by it lent, shall not exceed the sum of thirteen hundred dollars and thirty-three cents, and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter or renew at pleasure; and also to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or to the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth; and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do for the well being of the said corporation and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.
- SECT. 2.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the following shall be the fundamental articles of the said Society:
- Article I.** The objects of this society shall be the relief of its respective members when sick or disabled by bodily infirmity to pursue their ordinary avocations.
- Article II.** The officers of this society shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Secretary and Messenger, to be elected by ballot annually, and four stewards to be chosen quarterly; the duties of the officers and the time of their elections to be prescribed by the by-laws.
- Article III.** No person shall become a member of this society who shall not be a citizen of the United States and of this Commonwealth, and who shall not be at the time of his admission twenty-one years of age or upwards; and the elections for members shall be by ballot in the manner to be prescribed by the by-laws.
- Article IV.** Each person on being admitted a member of this society, shall pay such entrance money and monthly dues and contributions as the society may, by their by-laws, from time to time declare.
- Article V.** Any member may be removed from office or expelled from the society, whose monthly dues or other contributions are due and unpaid for ten months, for a violation of these articles, for breach of trust or improper conduct rendering him an unfit associate for men of honor and honesty: *Provided*, he is afforded an opportunity of making a defence before the society.
- Article VI.** The benefits of this society shall be distributed in the manner hereafter to be provided in the by-laws; and no person shall be entitled to any benefit from this society until he shall have been one year a member.

Article VII. The stated meetings of this society shall ^{Stated meet-} be held monthly, at such time and place as may from time ^{ings, &c.} to time be regulated and declared by the society; and five members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article VIII. By-laws must be proposed at least one ^{By-laws.} month previous to their adoption; and a motion to alter or repeal a by-law must lay over at least one month prior to its being acted upon.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That nothing in this act contained shall be deemed to authorize the said society to engage, directly or indirectly, in any banking, commercial, mining or manufacturing concerns, or to act in any other way than as a beneficial society ^{To have no other privileges than as a relief society.} for the relief of its respective members.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That this act shall continue in force ten years from the ^{Term of act 10 years unless sooner annulled.} passing thereof and no longer, for the purposes aforesaid; and the Legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter at any time hereafter.

Extending "An act securing to mechanics and others, payment for their labour and materials in erecting any house or other building, within the city and county of Philadelphia," to the counties of Chester, Butler and Perry.
