AN ACT

Relative to the Carlisle and Hanover turnpike road company, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the president and managers of the Carlisle and Hanover turnpike road company shall be authorized to charge and receive the full amount of tolls allowed by the act incorporating the said company, and so much of the act of assembly, approved the tenth of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the time of holding the annual elections of the Philadelphia and Great Bend turnpike road company, and of making their annual report to the Auditor General, be and the same is hereby changed to the first Thursday succeeding the third Monday of January, in each and every year.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the act entitled "An act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Shamokin canal company," passed the fourteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, be and the same is hereby revived and declared to be in full force, and the term of three years, from the passage of this act, shall be allowed to commence, and seven years to complete the work, as contemplated in said act.

Act of incorporation, revived, &c.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the following named persons shall be commissioners to do and perform the several things mentioned in the first section of said act, viz: Lewis Dewart, Henry Masser, Edward Gobin, Isaac Seigler, Peter Weimer, Gideon Markel, John Robins, John G. Youngman, Charles G. Doanel, Martin Weaver, Henry Shaffer, Francis W. Rawle, James A. Gilmer, George Weiser, Henry Yoxtheimer, John Young, John G. Martin, Alexander Jordan, William M'Carty, George Weitzel, Daniel Levy, Peter Martz, George Prince, Samuel M'Cormick, John B. Price, William N. Robins, Christian Baldy, Daniel Bogar, Jacob Bright, Samuel John, John Jones, William H. Muench, Albe C. Barret and Peter Leisenring; and the books, as therein mentioned, shall be opened on or before the first Monday of October next: and in case the said company shall deem it expedient to construct a rail-road instead of a canal from the Shamokin coal mines to the river Susquehanna, as authorized by the ninth section of said act, the letters patent to be issued by the Governor, agreeably to the second section thereof, shall be to incorporate the said company by the name, style and title of "The Shamokin rail-road company."
