AN ACT

For the relief of Gabriel Abrams, a soldier, and Franey Young, widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Gabriel Abrams, of Fayette county, a soldier of the revolution, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Franey Young, of York county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

For the relief of John Lindsey and John Allison, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authori-

zed and required to pay to John Lindsey, of the city of Philadelphia, and John Allison, of Chester county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, each forty dollars, as a gratuity for their revolutionary services. ^{\$40 gratuities granted to each.}

AN ACT

To vest in Maria Dorothy Winklefoss, the right of this Commonwealth, to the estate of her illegitimate sister, Maria Antoinette Winklefoss, late of the township of Spring Garden, in the county of York.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all right, claims and interest which this commonwealth may have acquired by reason of any escheat, from the want of heirs of Maria Antoinette Winklefoss, formerly of Spring Garden township, York county, deceased, in an estate whereof she died seized or possessed, shall be and the same is hereby granted to Maria Dorothy Winklefoss: *Provided,* That no other claim or right of this commonwealth, except that derived by said escheat, shall pass by virtue of this act, nor shall the right of individuals be in any wise affected or impaired thereby, and that the said estate shall be subject to the tax imposed by the act relating to collateral inheritance.
