

Suits for sums over \$500 in which Pres't. of Com. Pleas may be, or have been, interested, may be removed to Circuit Court at any time after first day of term.

personally interested in the event of any suit or action now pending, or hereafter to be instituted in his district, or has been concerned as counsel or attorney for either of the parties, or others under whom they or either of them claim, or whenever it shall happen that the title under which the parties or either of them, claim in any such suit or action shall have been derived from or through such president, then and in either of these cases, where the sum in controversy shall exceed the sum of five hundred dollars, all such suits or actions may be removed into the Circuit court, at any time after the first day of the term to which such suit or action may have been instituted, and shall be removed and proceeded in to trial, judgment and execution, in the manner directed by the act to enable the justices of the Supreme court to hold Circuit courts.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act to erect M'Connellsburg, in the county of Bedford, into a borough.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by the neglect of the high constable of the borough of M'Connellsburg, in the county of Bedford, no election was held for officers of said borough, on the first Monday of May last, for remedy whereof—

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the late high constable of the borough of M'Connellsburg, in the county aforesaid, be and he is hereby empowered to notify the inhabitants of said borough to hold an election, at such convenient time as may be deemed proper, which election, when held, shall be as valid and effectual as it held on the first Monday of May aforesaid.

High Const. in McConnellsburg to hold new election for borough officers.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the act to which this is a supplement be and the same is hereby revived and continued in full force, as if the election aforesaid had been duly held; and in case the citizens of the said borough of M'Connellsburg should fail to elect borough officers on the day appointed by law for holding such elections, such failure shall not be deemed to invalidate or render void the charter of said borough, but it shall and may be lawful for the citizens thereof to hold a new election for the choice of such officers, at such time and place as they may think proper, giving at least ten days notice of the same, any thing contained in the act to which this is a supplement to the contrary notwithstanding.

Original act revived and continued. Failure to hold future elections provided for.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate the borough of Gettysburg, in the county of Adams."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, all persons residing at least three months within the borough of Gettysburg, immediately preceding any borough election, entitled to vote for members of the legislature, shall be entitled to vote for officers of the said borough of Gettysburg.

Qualified citizens resident three months, entitled to vote for borough officers.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the law to which this is a further supplement, and its supplements, as is hereby altered and supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Repeal of inconsistent parts of former acts.
