A SUPPLEMENT

To the act to authorize the printing and distribution of an additional number of the pamphlet laws.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the price to be allowed for folding, stitching, and delivering the pamphlet laws, including the laws of the present session, shall be six dollars per sheet for the number of sheets contained in one copy.

Price of folding, stitching, &c. fixed at \$6 per sheet.

AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers, and the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Lambert and Michael Hartman of Berks county, and Zachariah Clossom of Montgomery county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, as a gratuity and compensation in full for their revolutionary services.

\$40 gratuities granted to J. Lambert, M. Hartman and Z. Clossom.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Mary Berlin of Crawford county, widow of Isaac Berlin, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, during life, to commence on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

\$40 grat. and ann. from 1st March to M. Berlin.

Same to P.
Wambach.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Philip Wambach, of York county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, during life, to commence on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Wilson, a soldier of the revolution, and to James Sayer, of Dauphin county, a revolutionary soldier, or to their respective orders, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of the internal improvement fund to apply certain monies to the payment of interest.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the internal improvement fund be and they are hereby authorized and required, if there should be any deficiency in the fund for the payment of interest, on the first day of August next, to apply such portion of the monies that may be in their hands, for the construction of canals and rail-roads, as will meet the de-
