AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of the internal improvement fund to apply certain monies to the payment of interest.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the internal improvement fund be and they are hereby authorized and required, if there should be any deficiency in the fund for the payment of interest, on the first day of August next, to apply such portion of the monies that may be in their hands, for the construction of canals and rail-roads, as will meet the de-

iciency, which sum or sums are to be repaid out of the funds pledged for the payment of interest.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act to authorize the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over the river Lehigh, near the town of Northampton," passed twenty-eighth March, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, and the act to revise and amend an act entitled, "An act to authorize the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over the river Lehigh, near the town of Northampton," passed twenty-eighth March, eighteen hundred and six.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president, managers and company, for erecting a bridge over the river Lehigh, near the town of Northampton, may, if they deem it necessary, remove the said bridge from where it now stands, any distance not exceeding one fourth of a mile, either above or below its present site; and as soon as a good and complete bridge is erected over the said river Lehigh, at the place to be fixed upon within the limits aforesaid by the said company, the property of said bridge shall be vested in the said company aforesaid, their successors and assigns forever; and the said company, their successors and assigns, may demand and receive toll from travellers and others passing over the same, agreeably to the rates established by the ninth, tenth, and thirteenth sections of the act of twenty-eighth March, seventeen hundred and ninety seven: *Providd always,* That nothing in this act contained, shall extend to authorize the
