AN ACT

For the relief of Thomas Milliken and Jesse M'Quaid.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of the county of Perry be, and they are hereby authorized, to settle and adjust the accounts of Thomas Milliken and Jesse M'Quaid, for building a bridge over the mouth of Sherman's creek, in said county, upon just and equitable principles, and submit the same to the court of Quarter Sessions and grand jury of the said county, for their approbation; and if the same shall be approved by the said court and grand jury respectively, to pay the balance which may be found due to the said Thomas and Jesse, out of the funds of the said county.

AN ACT

To provide for the divisibility and transfer of the certificate of loan granted to the Union Canal company of Pennsylvania, in like manner with the other loans of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 1. It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the certificate of loan for two hundred thousand dollars, issued to the Union Canal company of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the third section of the act entitled, "An act for the entire abolition of lotteries," passed the first of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-three, shall be divisible and transferable at the Bank of Pennsylvania, in the city of Philadelphia, in the same manner that other loans of this Commonwealth are divisible and transferable at the said bank; and it shall be the duty of the said bank to issue certificates upon
