## No. 22.

### AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to William Long, of Delaware county, and to Jacob Hammer, of Lancaster county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-four. Annuity and gratuity to Wm. Long & J. Hammer.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Archibald Derrah, of Bucks county, or to his order, forty dollars, as a gratuity, and in full for his revolutionary services. Gratuity to Arch. Derrah.

SECTION 3. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Nancy Mayburry, of Montgomery county, widow of Joseph Mayburry, and to Mary McIlhattan, of Lancaster county, widow of Samuel McIlhattan, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-four. Annuity and gratuity to N. Maybury and Mary McIlhattan.
