AN ACT

For the relief of Andrew Wallace, a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the officers of the Land Office be, and they are hereby authorized and required to issue to Andrew Wallace, of Chester county, a soldier of the war of the revolution, in consideration of his services in the said war, and of his present advanced age, on his producing to them the usual documents and evidence of title, a patent for a certain tract of land on which he now resides, in Lower Oxford township, Chester county, containing one hundred acres and a half, besides the usual allowance of six per cent., free from any charge for arrears of purchase money to the Commonwealth, or fees of office : *Provided,* That nothing in this act contained, shall affect or impair the right of any other person to the said tract of land, or any part thereof.

AN ACT

For the relief of John Sparry, Isaac Sullender, James Hogge and Conrad Schlagle, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Sparry, of Montgomery county, Isaac Sullender, of Delaware county, James Hogge, of Bucks county, and to Conrad Schlagle, of Northampton county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to

each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the "Act relative to actions of ejectment."

WHEREAS, inconvenience frequently occurs to plaintiffs in ejectment, from the re-entry of the defendants, or persons claiming under them, on the lands recovered, after the execution and return of the writ of *habere facias possessionem*; and the plaintiffs are obliged to resort to a new ejectment, and it is proper to render recoveries in ejectment more effectual:

Courts, on application, to award alias & pluries writs of hab. fac. poss. in eject. tho' former ones may have been executed. Proviso. Application to be made within 3 yrs. after return of former writ.

Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the court, in which a judgment in ejectment shall be recovered, on the application of the plaintiff, his agent or attorney, and on cause shown, to award *alias* and *pluries* writs of *habere facias possessionem*, from time to time, notwithstanding any or all preceding writs may have been returned executed; and the additional costs shall be taxed and collected in the usual manner: *Provided*, That such application shall be made within three years after the return day of the preceding writ.
