

Joshua Percival and wife, and formerly of Anthony Cuthbert, deceased, and on the west, by Schuylkill Eighth street, in said city, shall be, and are hereby specifically pledged; and the said loans shall be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the said Walnut street prison and Prune street apartments, and the lots thereto belonging, and of the Arch street prison, and the lots thereto belonging; and in case of the property thus pledged should not be sufficient to cover the said loan, then the county shall be answerable therefor, and it is hereby declared to be answerable for the repayment of any deficiency.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia, to provide, from time to time, and pay over to the said commissioners, sufficient sums of money to meet the interest which may become due, half yearly, on said loan; and for that purpose they are hereby authorized and required to raise money in any mode or manner in which money for the ordinary purposes and expenses of said county may by law be raised or obtained.

AN ACT

For the endowment of Pennsylvania College at Gettysburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor shall, on the first Monday of June next, draw his warrant on the State Treasurer, in favor of the trustees of the Pennsylvania College at Gettysburg, for the sum of three thousand dollars, and on the same day of each and every year for the space of five years thereafter, for the sum of three thousand dollars, to be applied to the lawful purposes of said institution: *Provided,* That the first mentioned three thousand dollars shall be applied exclusively to the purchase of a site, and erection of a college edifice; that the said trustees shall cause gratuitous instruction to be given to fifteen young men annually, (if that number apply from this Commonwealth) in the elementary branches of an English

education, in such manner as the said trustees shall deem best calculated to qualify them for teachers of common schools : *And provided also*, That the trustees shall, on or before the 2d proviso. said first Monday of June next, give security to the Commonwealth to the satisfaction of the Governor, to raise and apply a like sum to the same object from other sources ; and if such security be not given by the time aforesaid, then the Governor shall draw his warrant for said sum as soon thereafter as such security shall be given : *And provided also*, That said trustees shall never charge more than five dollars per annum room rent, to each student who may occupy rooms in said college building. 3d proviso.

AN ACT

Supplementary to an act entitled, " An act to incorporate the Philadelphia, Germantown, and Norristown rail-road company."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the Philadelphia, Germantown and Norristown rail-road company be, and are hereby authorized to construct, continue, and extend the line of their rail-road, from a point on the main line of said road, at or near Robeson's mill, on the Wissahickon creek, in the township of Roxborough, in the county of Philadelphia, to intersect that part of their road now made from Philadelphia to Germantown, at such point as shall appear most expedient and proper to the president and managers of said company ; and to make, construct, and lay a lateral railway, from the main line of said rail road, to branch off between Spring Mill and Norristown, not exceeding six miles in length ; and to use the same for the purpose of transportation and conveyance ; and for the purpose of making, constructing, and laying out said extension and lateral railway, to search for stone, gravel, and other materials, except wood, for constructing the same, and to enter in and upon, and over, and occupy any land which they shall deem necessary, in the manner
