## AN ACT

To authorize the Appraisers of Damages on the Pennsylvania Canal to settle and adjust the claim of damages of Andrew Boggs.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the appraisers of damages on the Pennsylvania canal, as soon as practicable, to ascertain the amount of damage done to and sustained by Andrew Boggs, in the carrying away and destruction of his salt on the Kiskiminetas river, by the freshet of the month of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two; and if, in their opinion, the said loss was occasioned by the existence of the dams in said river, then to report the amount of damages they shall think the said Andrew Boggs shall in equity and justice be entitled to, which sum so reported shall be paid out of the damage fund, as in other cases of damages, sustained by reason of the construction of the Pennsylvania canal: *Provided*, said damages so assessed, shall in no event exceed the sum of fifteen thousand dollars.

## AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and a widow of a soldier of the revolution.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and is hereby authorized and required to pay unto Jacob Spare and Edward Roberts, of Montgomery county, soldiers of the revolutionary war, or to

their respective orders, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and required to pay unto Alexander Wright, of Mercer county, <sup>Gratuity to</sup> Alex. Wright. or to his order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately, as a compensation for his revolutionary services.

SECTION 3. The State Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and required to pay unto Jane Read, of Chester county, or to her <sup>Gratuity to</sup> Jane Read. order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately, in full of all claims.

### AN ACT

To incorporate the Dingman's Choice and Delaware Bridge Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the capital stock of the Dingman's Choice and Delaware bridge company, for erecting a bridge over the river Delaware, at Dingman's ferry, in Pike county, shall amount to <sup>Capital,</sup> fifteen thousand dollars, and that the same shall be divided into <sup>\$15000.</sup> shares of fifty dollars each; and the subscribers to the said capital stock shall pay the sum or sums of money for the share <sup>\$50 a share,</sup> or shares by them respectively subscribed, at such periods, and in such proportions, as the directors of said company may determine.

SECTION 2. Jacob Westbrook, Daniel W. Dingman, William Overfield and Garret Brodhead, junior, are hereby appointed commissioners on the part of this state, who, with the commissioners to be appointed by the state of New Jersey, shall be authorized to receive subscriptions to the said capital stock, at such times and places as they, or a majority of them <sup>Comm'rs in conjunction with com'rs appointed by N. Jersey, or a majority of them, to receive sub-</sup> may direct, giving notice thereof in a newspaper published in the county of Pike; and if no paper is published in said county, then in a paper published in Northampton or Wayne counties, and also in a paper published in the county of Sussex, in the <sup>scriptions.</sup>
