

son, appointed by the town council as aforesaid, shall neglect, or refuse to take upon himself the duties of the office to which he shall be so appointed, shall forfeit and pay for the use of the corporation the sum of twenty dollars, unless he can render to the said council a satisfactory reason why he should be exonerated from such service. \$20 penalty for refusing to accept office.

SECTION 15. If any person or persons shall think him, her, or themselves aggrieved by any thing done in pursuance of this act, except in what relates to the imposing and collecting the borough tax, and appointments made by the town council, he, she, or they may appeal to the next Court of Common Pleas to be held for the said county, upon giving security, according to law, to prosecute his, her, or their appeal with effect; and the said court having taken such order therein as shall seem to them just and reasonable, the same shall be conclusive against all parties. Right of appeal to the court of C. P. except in cases relating to appointments and taxation.

SECTION 16. From and after the third Friday in March next, the act entitled "An act to erect the towns of Waterford and New Haven, in the county of Lancaster, into a borough," passed on the sixth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twelve, as also an act entitled "An act, amending the act, entitled 'An act to incorporate the towns of Waterford and New Haven, in the county of Lancaster, into a borough,'" passed on the sixteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and so much of the act entitled "An act to incorporate sundry boroughs, and for other purposes," passed the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, as relates to the borough of Marietta, be, and the same are hereby repealed. Repeals former acts.

AN ACT

Granting Andrew Dennis compensation for a tract of donation land.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized

and required to pay to Andrew Dennis, of the state of Ohio, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, two hundred dollars, as compensation in full for a tract of donation land, to which he was entitled for his revolutionary services.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, "An act to incorporate the district of Spring Garden," passed the twenty second day of March, eighteen hundred and thirteen.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the persons who shall, at every election, have the highest number of votes for the office of commissioner of said district, together with the commissioners whose term shall not have expired, shall meet together at the commissioners' hall in the said district, between the hours of nine and eleven in the forenoon, on the fourth day next subsequent to each and every election, to be held in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, and then and there shall receive the returns of commissioners elect, and shall forthwith proceed to examine the same, and to judge and determine thereon; and for that purpose the said commissioners so met, or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority to judge thereof, and to confirm or set aside the same, and to order new elections, as the case may require.

Com'rs whose terms have not expired, & the persons highest on the return, to meet the 4th day after election to examine returns

Power to confirm or set aside election

SECTION 2. The board of commissioners shall have full power and authority to appoint a suitable person or persons, under such security and penalties as to them may appear necessary, for the inspection and measurement of all cord wood that may be landed or offered for sale, within any part of said district; and to make, ordain and establish such laws, ordinances and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws and constitution of this Commonwealth, as shall be necessary and convenient for affixing the tolls and rates of wharfrage for all articles brought to public landings, within the said incorporated district; for the regulation of the rate of travelling, and the use
