

counts pertaining thereto, upon demand being made by the bur-
gess or council; that the treasurer, constable, or collector,
as well as all other officers who may be appointed by the coun-
cil, shall render their accounts whenever so required to do,
which accounts, being adjusted and settled, shall be published
once in each year, in some newspaper printed in the borough;
or by advertisements set up at four of the most public places in
said borough, particularly showing the amount of taxes laid and
collected, and the expenditures.

Dogs and
bitches may
be taxed.
Proviso.

SECTION 15. It shall and may be lawful for the burgess and
town council, at any time to levy and collect taxes on the own-
ers of dogs and bitches, not exceeding one dollar for each dog,
nor two dollars for each bitch, in any one year: *Provided*,
That these animals shall not be taxable until they are three
months old.

Borough to be
an election
district.

SECTION 16. The said borough of Lawrenceville is hereby
erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof
shall hereafter hold their elections at the town house in the said
borough; and that an inspector of the general election, assessor
and assistant assessors, shall be elected by the inhabitants, at
the same time, and under the same regulations, and subject to
similar duties and liabilities as the inspectors and assessors who
are now by law authorized to be elected by the several town-
ships, and that the judges and clerks shall be appointed to su-
perintend and assist at the general elections, as those officers
are now appointed in the several townships.

AN ACT

To recharter the Kensington Bank, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Re-
presentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General
Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the
same, That the act entitled, "An act to recharter certain
banks," approved the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand
eight hundred and twenty-four, be and the same is hereby ex-
tended to the Kensington bank, in the county of Philadelphia,*

for fifteen years from the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

SECTION 2. The stockholders of the Kensington bank of the county of Philadelphia, may hereafter elect seven directors, who shall be residents of the incorporated district of Kensington, and shall have resided in said district at least one year, and shall have no interest in any thing in their act of incorporation to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 3. So much of the second article of the third section of the act entitled, "An act to recharter certain banks," passed the twenty-fifth day of March, eighteen hundred and twenty-four, as provides that no person shall be eligible as a director, for more than three years out of four, and not more than three fourths of the directors shall be eligible to be elected for the succeeding year, except the president, be and the same is hereby revived, as far as regards the rechartering of the bank by this act.

SECTION 4. Whenever the profits of the bank rechartered by this act shall be such, that the clear annual dividend shall exceed the sum of twelve per cent. per annum on the amount of the capital actually paid in, then one half of such surplus shall be paid into the State Treasury for the general purposes of education; and it is hereby provided that the bank, in its annual report, shall state the amount of dividends declared.

SECTION 5. The privileges hereby granted to the said bank, shall be subject to such alterations, provisions and restrictions, as the Legislature may at any time hereafter think proper to enact, for the better regulation of the banking institutions of this Commonwealth, and shall be liable to such taxes, whether on dividends or otherwise, as the Legislature may at any time hereafter impose.
