A SUPPLEMENT

To an act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Strasburg rail road, the Williamsport and Elmira rail road, the Marietta and Columbia rail road, the Portsmouth and Lancaster rail road, and incorporating a company to make the Oxford rail road.

Additional comm'rs appointed for the Portsmouth & Lancaster rail-road.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John Jardon, Hezekiah Buzby, Henry Witmer and Cornelius S. Smith, of Philadelphia, William Cooper, John Latshaw and William Frick, of Lancaster, Okey Hendrickson, William D. Slaymaker, James Laird, Samuel S. Patterson, Christian Hershey and Doctor Simon Meredith, of Mountjoy, George Wisler, senior, Philip Albert, senior, George Redsecker, junior, Adams Campbell, Andrew Wade, esquire, and Jacob Gish, of Elizabethtown, Jacob M. Haldeman, Henry Walters, Michael Burke and Henry Buehler, of Harrisburg, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, in addition to those already appointed, to do and perform the several duties enjoined by the act to which this is a supplement, and having relation solely to the Portsmouth and Lancaster rail road.

Elizabetht'n to be a point in said rail-road.

SECTION 2. The seventy-seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, relating to the location of the said road, is hereby altered and supplied, so as to make the borough of Eliza-

bethtown a point in said road : *Provided*, The same can be *Proviso*. done, in the opinion of the engineer and managers of said company, without injuring the location of said road materially.

AN ACT

For the relief of James Huston and others, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to James Huston, of Washington county, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay Jacob Gher, of Crawford county, and to Wil. Jacob Gher & Wm. Able, of Montgomery county, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, as a gratuity, and in full for their revolutionary services.
