AN ACT

Granting aid to Washington College.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor shall, on the first day of May next, draw his warrant on the State Treasurer, in favor of the trustees of Washington College, in Washington county, for the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, and annually thereafter, on the first day of May, for three years, he shall draw his warrant in favor of said trustees, for the sum of one thousand ^{Grant of} ~~2500.~~ dollars, to be applied to the support of the institution.

AN ACT

For the endowment of La Fayette College at Easton.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized and required, at any time between the date of the passage of this act and the first of January next, that may be most convenient to the treasury, to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the trustees of La Fayette College, for the sum of four ^{Grant of} ~~thousand~~ ^{\$12,000 in 5} ~~dollars,~~ ^{instalments.} and annually, for four successive years, to draw his warrant in favor of said trustees, for the sum of two thousand dollars, to commence on the first day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-five: *Provided,* That no part of the money drawn as above, shall be applied to the payment of teachers.

SECTION 2. The board of trustees of said college shall annually, in the month of January, report to the Legislature a full and complete account of the money drawn, agreeably to the provisions of this act, and the purposes to which it has been applied, with an account of the general condition of the institution.

AN ACT

Authorizing the election of additional supervisors in North Beaver township, Beaver county, Ross township, Allegheny county, and West Salem and Mahoning townships, Mercer county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors in North Beaver township, Beaver county, to elect annually, at the usual time and place of electing township officers, four qualified citizens for supervisors of the roads, who shall be subject to the same penalties, and governed by the same rules and regulations, by which supervisors are by law regulated.

SECTION 2. From and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors of Ross township, Allegheny county, to elect annually, at their usual place of electing township officers, one additional supervisor, who shall reside in and superintend the roads, in what is called the reserve tract, in said township, subject to the same rules and regulations by which supervisors are by law regulated.

SECTION 3. From and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the electors of West Salem township, Mercer county, to elect annually, at their usual place of electing township officers, four additional supervisors of the highways in said township; and the electors of Mahoning township,
