AN ACT

To incorporate "The Orphan Asylum Society of Pittsburg and Allegheny."

WHEREAS, It is represented to the Legislature, that a number of ladies in the city of Pittsburg and borough of Allegheny, have associated themselves together for the humane and charitable purposes of protecting, relieving, supporting and instructing orphan children in said places, and pray to be incorporated: Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all such persons of the female sex as now are or hereafter may become subscribers to "The Orphan Asylum Society of Pittsburg and Allegheny," in the manner hereinafter provided, be and are hereby incorporated into a society, by the name of "The Orphan Asylum of Pittsburg and Allegheny," and by Name. that name shall have perpetual succession, with power to have a common seal and change the same at pleasure, and to make all contracts relative to the institution, to sue and be sued by their corporate name, and by that name and style to be capable in law of purchasing, taking, holding and conveying any estate, real or personal, for the use of said corporation: *Provided,* That the annual income shall not exceed in value eight thousand dollars, nor be applied to any other purposes than those for which this incorporation is formed; and also to establish by-laws and regulations for said society, and the preservation and application of the funds thereof: *Provided,* That the same be not repugnant to the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this Commonwealth. SECTION 2. Every female who shall subscribe and pay to the funds of the society a sum not less than one dollar annually, shall, by such subscription and payment, become a member of said society, liable, however, to be removed whenever she shall refuse or neglect her annual subscription; and every female who shall subscribe and pay the sum of fifty dollars, shall be considered and be a member for life. Membership.

SECTION 3. The society shall meet on the second Tuesday of May in every year, at which meeting fifteen members shall be competent to transact business; at this meeting, there shall be chosen, annually, sixteen managers, in whom shall be vested the management, direction and disposal of all the concerns of the society; and if any vacancy shall be occasioned by the death, removal, resignation, or otherwise, of any of said managers, the same may be filled for the remainder of the year, by Time of meeting, and election of managers.

such member being an annual or life subscriber as aforesaid, as the board of managers for the time being shall appoint; and until the election on the said second Tuesday of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, the managers shall be as follows:—Elizabeth F. Denny, Anna Halsey, Mary Robinson, Mary B. Herron, Elizabeth Tiernan, Mary Wilkins, Marion Young, Margaret George, Margaret Bruce, Hannah Higby, Elizabeth P. Halsey, Mary A. S. Baird, Susan K. Wade and Isabella Simpson.

Other officers.

SECTION 4. The managers shall meet, upon notice from the officiating secretary of the society, within three days after their election, and shall choose out of their number a first and second directress, a secretary, and a treasurer; that three managers shall be competent to transact business, the board having been notified of the meeting; that they shall make by-laws for their own government; shall make an annual report of their proceedings and of the state of the funds, and give three days notice of any general meeting of the society.

SECTION 5. If the annual election be omitted on the day stated and appointed by this act, the said society shall not thereby be dissolved, but the managers and officers shall continue in office until a new election, which shall be held at such time and place, and after such notice as the board of managers shall prescribe.

SECTION 6. The ground and buildings thereon erected, for the use and accommodation of said society, shall be free of tax, while so occupied by said society.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from the Philadelphia and Great Bend turnpike, in Abington township, to intersect the Milford and Owego turnpike road, at or east of Montrose.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be and he is hereby authorized and*
