AN ACT

To prevent the destruction of Fish in Stony Creek, and its tributary Streams.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That any person or persons, who shall or may make use of any poisonous or destructive substance, by throwing or causing the same to be thrown into the said creek or any of its tributary streams, or who shall wantonly and maliciously kill or injure the fish, or use any other means by which they may destroy fish, which are not of a suitable size and fit for use, such person or persons, so offending, on conviction thereof, before a justice of the peace, of the county where such offence shall have been committed, shall pay a fine of five dollars for every such offence, to be recovered as debts of equal amount are by law recoverable, by any person or persons who may sue for the same; one moiety thereof to be paid to the informer, and the other moiety to be paid to the supervisors of the roads of the township where such conviction shall have taken place, to be applied by them to the improvement of the roads of said township.
