

SECTION 3. From and after the passage of this act, the corporate name, style and title of the company incorporated in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, shall be the Fairmount Bridge Company; by which name, style and title, ^{Style;} the said company shall enjoy every right, title, interest, privilege, power and immunity which under their former corporate designation, they might, could or did enjoy, or might hereafter have enjoyed.

SECTION 4. The annual meeting of the stockholders of the company aforesaid, shall in future be held on the second Monday, ^{Annual meet-} day in February in each and every year, and that all the officers now elected shall continue to discharge their duties and enjoy their rights and powers until the said first Monday of February next, or until others are elected in their room. ^{ings, when held.}

AN ACT

To improve a road from John Rigner's in Moore township, Northampton county, across the Blue mountain at Smith's Gap, to John Smith's, Ross township, in said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to be paid to George Schlabach of Upper Nazareth, Theobald Sheffer of Moore, and John Smith of Ross, on warrants drawn by the Governor on the treasurer of this Commonwealth, and shall be expended by them in improving a road across the Blue mountain at Smith's Gap, from the house of John Rigner in Moore township, to John Smith's in Ross township, Northampton county; and the said commissioners shall be allowed one dollar each, for every day necessarily spent in the performance of the duties required of them by this section, to be paid out of the treasury of Northampton county. ^{\$1500 appropriated,}

SECTION 2. Before the said commissioners shall draw the money hereby appropriated, they shall enter into bonds to the

Commonwealth, with one or more sureties, to be approved of by one of the judges of the court of Common Pleas of the county of Northampton, for the faithful and judicious expenditure of said money.

SECTION 3. The said commissioners shall, as soon as the said money is expended, make report to the court of Quarter Sessions of the county of Northampton; and upon such report, so made, the court is hereby directed to appoint three citizens of said county, whose duty it shall be to view said road and make report of the same to said court, particularly setting forth, whether or not said money was judiciously expended, agreeably to the provisions of this act; and if the report shall be approved by the court, then, and in that case the said bond shall be null and void, for which service they shall be allowed one dollar and fifty cents per day, to be paid out of the county treasury aforesaid.

AN ACT

Authorizing the clerk of the Orphan's Court of Berks county to record certain papers in his office.

Clerk of O. C.
to make
docket entries

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the clerk of the Orphan's Court of the county of Berks is hereby authorized, under direction of said court, to make the necessary and proper docket entries of the proceedings of said Court, from the papers on file in the office of the said clerk, in all cases where such entries have not heretofore been made by the proper officers for the period of time between the twelfth day of May, Anno Domini, one thousand seven hundred and fifty-two, and the tenth day of November, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred thirty-two.

SECTION 2. After the docket entries shall have been completed and approved by the said Orphan's Court, it shall be the duty of the commissioners to allow him such sum for his services, in making the entries aforesaid, as the recorder of said
