SECTION 3. The said commissioners shall, as soon as the said money is expended, make report to the court of Quarter Sessions of the county of Northampton; and upon such report, so made, the court is hereby directed to appoint three citizens of said county, whose duty it shall be to view said road and make report of the same to said court, particularly setting forth, whether or not said money was judiciously expended, agreeably to the provisions of this act; and if the report shall be approved by the court, then, and in that case the said bond shall be null and void, for which service they shall be allowed one dollar and fifty cents per day, to be paid out of the county treasury aforesaid.

AN ACT

Authorizing the clerk of the Orphan's Court of Berks county to record certain papers in his office.

Clerk of O. C.
to make
docket entries

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the clerk of the Orphan's Court of the county of Berks is hereby authorized, under direction of said court, to make the necessary and proper docket entries of the proceedings of said Court, from the papers on file in the office of the said clerk, in all cases where such entries have not heretofore been made by the proper officers for the period of time between the twelfth day of May, Anno Domini, one thousand seven hundred and fifty-two, and the tenth day of November, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred thirty-two.

SECTION 2. After the docket entries shall have been completed and approved by the said Orphan's Court, it shall be the duty of the commissioners to allow him such sum for his services, in making the entries aforesaid, as the recorder of said

county of Berks is entitled for recording of deeds, &c., which sum shall be paid on warrants drawn by the said commissioners of Berks county on the treasurer of the county aforesaid: *Provided*, The cost shall not exceed four hundred dollars.

AN ACT

Providing for the appointment of a Wood Corder within the borough of York.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the burgesses and assistant burgesses of the borough of York, or a quorum of them, are hereby authorized and required, on the second Monday of May, in every year, to appoint a corder or measurer of wood for said borough, and the same from time to time for good causes to remove, and to fill all vacancies occasioned by such removal, death or otherwise, whose duty it shall be, either by himself or deputy, duly appointed by him, to cord or measure, when called upon, any wood sold or offered for sale in said borough, for which services the corder aforesaid shall receive a compensation, to be paid by the vender, of ten cents for each cord, seven cents for each three quarters of a cord and five cents for any less quantity; and in all cases where the wood so sold shall not hold out the full measure which the vender sold or offered the same at, if the measuring or cording shall be done within twenty-four hours after the sale or offer for sale, as aforesaid, the seller shall forfeit one-half the amount to be paid to the corder aforesaid, for the use of said borough, which the purchaser had paid or agreed to pay him for the same, and in case of refusal of payment, the corder aforesaid may recover the same by suit, in like manner as other debts of like amount are recoverable, with costs; the corder or measurer to pay the amount received into the borough treasury, first deducting ten per cent. for his services.
