AN ACT

To prevent the destruction of Trout in the Big Spring in the county of Cumberland, and for other purposes. *¶*

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That if any person shall fish for, or wilfully catch or kill trout, in the Big Spring in the county of Cumberland, from the first day of September to the first day of May, in each and every year, or a non-proprietor, at any other time, without consent of the owner, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for every such offence. Penalty \$5.

SECTION 2. If any person shall enter in and upon the premises of any owner of land on the said Big Spring at night, for the purpose of fishing in the said Big Spring, in the county of Cumberland, with lights or torches, without the consent of the owner of such land first had and obtained, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for every such offence. Penalty \$5.

SECTION 3. Where any penalty, inflicted by this act, shall be incurred, the same shall be recoverable by action of debt, in the name of the commonwealth, as debts of a similar amount are by law recoverable, and when recovered, such penalty shall be paid to the supervisors of the roads of the proper township, for the use of the public highways therein.
