AN ACT

To authorize the executors of the last will and testament of Jacob Hiestand, deceased, to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Philip Geissinger and Jacob Hiestand, executors of the last will and testament of Jacob Hiestand, late of Allen township, in the county of Northampton, deceased, are hereby authorized to sell, at public or private sale, as to them shall seem most conducive to the interest of said estate, all the real estate of said deceased, situated in the township of Bushkill, in the county of Northampton, or such part thereof as they shall think advisable, and to convey the same, either in whole or in parcels, to the purchaser or purchasers thereof: *Provided,* That before the execution of the deed or deeds for the premises, the said executors shall give bond, with such security as the Orphans' Court of Northampton county will approve of, conditioned for the faithful application and distribution of the proceeds of sale, as the said Orphans' Court, having reference to the last will and testament of the deceased, and the situation of his estate, shall order and decree.
