SECTION 5. All the contracts and agreements which the late trustees have entered into, and all things which by former laws they were authorized to do in and about the premises, shall and may be performed by the trustees herein created.

Oaths of
office.

SECTION 6. The trustees elected by virtue of this act, and their successors in office, shall, before they enter on the duties of their trust, before any judge or justice of the peace of this State, take and subscribe the oaths or affirmations prescribed by the constitution of this State to be taken by the officers of the State, and shall also take and subscribe an oath or affirmation for the faithful discharge of their respective trusts or office aforesaid.

Repeal.

SECTION 7. So much of any act or acts as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, An act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Mahanoy Navigation Company.

Time
extended.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the books for receiving subscriptions of stock to the said company, may be re-opened at any time before the first day of July, eighteen hundred and thirty-six, and said subscriptions may be taken hereafter as provided for in the original act, and that the time for commencing the work under said act is hereby extended to two years after the stock of said company shall have been subscribed, and for completing said improvements so as to render it fit for the conveyance of coal to the Pennsylvania canal to five years after the commencement of the same.

SECTION 2. The act passed the twenty-third day of February, eighteen hundred and thirty, incorporating the Penns

creek navigation company, is extended three years for commencing, and ten years for completing the said navigation, from and after the passage of this act.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Manayunk Athenæum and Library Company.

WHEREAS, A number of persons have associated for the purpose of promoting and encouraging literature, and the said persons are desirous of becoming incorporated : Therefore, Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the persons who constitute the Manayunk Athenæum and Library Company, or who shall hereafter be admitted members of the same, shall and hereby are declared to be a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "The Manayunk Athenæum and Library Company," to have perpetual succession, to plead and be impleaded, sue and be sued, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and be capable to take, hold and enjoy property to the amount of five thousand dollars, to use a common seal, and to alter or renew the same at pleasure. Style of corporation.
Capacities & privileges.

SECTION 2. The officers of said corporation, shall be such as the said corporation may think necessary, who shall be elected annually, or otherwise, as the rules and by-laws of the corporation may direct. Officers, and how elected.

SECTION 3. Said corporation, when convened, upon due notice given to the members, by public advertisement, or otherwise, shall have power and authority to make, ordain and establish such and so many rules, by-laws and ordinances, relating to the times of meeting, the admission of members, the power and duties of the officers thereof, and the ordering of the other concerns of the said corporation, as they may deem necessary and proper : *Provided*, That no rule, by-law or ordinance, as Powers.
Proviso.
