AN ACT

For the relief of sundry Volunteer Companies.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That swords, pistols and accoutrements, necessary for the equipment of one troop of cavalry in each brigade of militia in this Commonwealth, in addition to the two troops now authorized by law to receive such arms, shall be issued to said troops, if so many there be, and where there are more than that number of troops of cavalry now organized in any brigade, the three oldest troops shall be entitled to receive their respective quotas of swords, pistols and accoutrements, under this act: *Provided,* That each troop of cavalry shall be uniformed according to law.

2 troop added in addition.

SECTION 2. The Adjutant General is hereby required to issue his order for rifles, and the necessary accoutrements thereto belonging, to supply one rifle company in each brigade, in addition to the two companies already provided with rifles and accoutrements, provided the three companies which shall have been first uniformed and equipped, shall be entitled to such rifles and accoutrements: *Provided,* That such rifles and accoutrements be issued under such restrictions, provisions and security as are now by law required.

SECTION 3. So much of the thirty-seventh section of the act for the regulation of the militia of this Commonwealth, passed the second day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-two, as prescribed that volunteer companies, not belonging to any regiment or battalion of the volunteers, shall be attached to and train with the militia, on days of regimental training, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the Loyalhanna Light Dragoons and the Loyalhanna Light Infantry company of Westmoreland county, and the Harrisburg Greys and Infantry of Dauphin county.

Part of certain acts repealed, &c.

SECTION 4. The one hundred and twenty-first regiment of Pennsylvania volunteers, shall consist of two battalions: the companies of said regiment styled "The Mercer Light Infantry," "The Mercer Blues," "The Coolspring Greens," and "Shenango Marksmen," shall form the first battalion, and the company styled "The Wolf creek Rangers," "The Hazledburg Invincibles," and the company now commanded by Captain Bentley, shall form the second battalion of the said regiment, and when any other company shall be organized, and join the said regiment, the same shall be attached to such bat-

ation of the said regiment as the field officers of the same shall adjudge and determine, and the said officers are authorized to substitute battalion or company musters for inspection, instead of regimental musters and parades, and for that purpose they shall have power to fix the places for such musters, within the said regiment, having a regard to the most central and convenient places. And when any vacancy shall occur among the field officers of said regiment, an election shall be held to fill the same by each battalion, and the person having the highest number of votes given, in such regiment so voting in battalions, shall be elected.

SECTION 5. The Adjutant General is hereby authorized to issue swords, pistols and accoutrements, to the "Union Troops of Cavalry of Perry county," in case such swords, pistols and accoutrements shall remain, after supplying such corps as are now by law authorized to receive them by this act: *Provided*, That security shall be given to return the same, whenever they may be required to supply corps in other brigades, which have not now the number of such corps to which each brigade is by law entitled: *And provided also*, That all other security and conditions shall be given and observed, as are now by law required.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled, "An act to incorporate the York and Maryland line rail road company."
