AN ACT

To alter a certain line between the counties of Mifflin and Huntingdon on the river Juniata.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the county of Huntingdon as is contained within the following boundaries, shall be and the same is hereby annexed to the county of Mifflin; that is to say, beginning on the Juniata river so as to divide equally between the said counties that part of the road which passes around Blue Rock hill; thence due east until it strikes the Huntingdon and Mifflin county line; thence along said line to the Juniata river; thence up said river to the place of beginning; and the said part of Huntingdon county shall after the passage of this act be part of the county of Mifflin, and be in all respects subject to the jurisdiction thereof as fully as if it had been originally a part thereof.

AN ACT

To add five hundred dollars to the contingent fund of the State department.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be appropriated to the contingent fund of the State department, in addition to the present amount thereof, and that the same be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
