RESOLUTION

Relative to the Clifford and Wilkesbairre turnpike.

RESOLUTION

For the relief of John Kelker, late deputy marshal of the eastern district of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS by a resolution passed at the last session of the Legislature, and approved by the Governor of this Commonwealth on the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, John Kelker, late deputy marshal of the eastern district of Pennsylvania, was exonerated from the payment of a certain judgment obtained against him in the Circuit court for the county of Dauphin, at the suit of the said Commonwealth, but not from the payment of the costs of said suit: *Preamble.* And whereas, The same principle on which the amount of the judgment was released should extend to the costs, and as the practice has been established in the case of Isaac Griffith, late deputy marshal of Bucks county, by a resolution of the Legislature at their last session: Therefore,

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the Auditor General be and he is hereby authorized to set-

RESOLUTION

Relative to duty on foreign coal.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, an application is now pending in the Congress of the United States for the repeal or reduction of the duty on Nova Scotia and Liverpool coal: Therefore,

Repeal of duty on Foreign coal injurious to Penn'a.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That in the opinion of this Legislature, the repeal of the duty on foreign coals would be against the best policy of the country, and particularly injurious to the interests of the people of Pennsylvania; and that if any alteration be made in the tariff of duties upon this article, it should rather be increased than diminished.

Governor to transmit.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of the above resolution to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress, as an expression of the opinion of the Legislature of Pennsylvania.

Cl'k of Senate to transmit.

Resolved, That a copy of the report of the committee upon the subject of the coal trade be transmitted by the clerk of the Senate, to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
