RESOLUTION

Relative to the Clifford and Wilkesbairre turnpike.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,
That the State Treasurer be hereby authorized to pay to the treasurer of the Clifford and Wilkesbairre turnpike road company, the unexpended balance of an appropriation made to that company, by an act of Assembly, of one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, as appears by the Auditor General's report of December, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and that they apply the same on the road between Catlin's tavern and the Cocheston and Great Bend turnpike road, any thing in said act to the contrary notwithstanding.

RESOLUTION

For the relief of John Kelker, late deputy marshal of the eastern district of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS by a resolution passed at the last session of the Legislature, and approved by the Governor of this Commonwealth on the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, John Kelker, late deputy marshal of the eastern district of Pennsylvania, was exonerated from the payment of a certain judgment obtained against him in the Circuit court for the county of Dauphin, at the suit of the said Commonwealth, but not from the payment of the costs of said suit: *Preamble.*
And whereas, The same principle on which the amount of the judgment was released should extend to the costs, and as the practice has been established in the case of Isaac Griffith, late deputy marshal of Bucks county, by a resolution of the Legislature at their last session: Therefore,

That the Auditor General be and he is hereby authorized to set-
