**An Act**

To authorize the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal church in Carlisle, Cumberland county, to sell and convey certain real estate.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Hugh Reed, John Phillips, Abel Keeney, Isaac Bell, David Reisinger, Michael Dipple, Theodore Myers, Charles Bell, trustees of the Methodist Episcopal church in Carlisle, Cumberland county, are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple, all the estate, right, title and interest of the said trustees and of the members of the said church, of, in and to the lot and church building erected thereon, of the said trustees and members, situate in the borough of Carlisle, Cumberland county, on Church alley, and numbered ninety-nine in the general plan of the said borough.

**An Act**

To change a part of the line between the counties of Franklin and Cumberland, to establish the division line between the counties of Huntingdon and Mifflin, and relative to the line between Perry and Juniata.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the line dividing the county of Franklin from the county of Cumberland, shall be altered as follows, viz: Beginning on the public road leading from Strasburg to Shippensburg, at the point where said road crosses said line; thence by the middle of said road to its junction with the turnpike road in the borough of Shippensburg;

thence across said turnpike road, south thirty-six and a half degrees, east through the centre of an alley to the county line.— And that the lands, lots and inhabitants, lying southward of said line be and the same are hereby declared to be in, and a part of the township of Southampton, in the county of Franklin, to all intents and purposes whatever, and so much of any law as is hereby altered or supplied is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Francis Sample of the county of Huntingdon, David Haugh of the county of Mifflin, and John Campbell of the county of Centre, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners for the purpose of running and marking the division line between the counties of Huntingdon and Mifflin, from the Juniata river, Jacks narrows, to the line of Centre county, agreeable to the provisions and directions of an act of the General Assembly, passed on the thirtieth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine entitled "An act for the better ascertaining the boundary line between the counties of Cumberland, Bedford and Northumberland." SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the said commissioners or any two of them, on or before the first Monday of June next, to survey and mark said line, agreeably to the provisions of the foregoing section, and make duplicate drafts of the same, inserting thereon the courses and distances in words at full length; one of which drafts they shall deposit in each of the prothonotaries offices of the aforesaid counties, which shall thereafter be considered a public record. SECTION 4. The commissioners appointed to run and mark said line, shall make out an account of their incidental expenses in performing the duties enjoined on them by this act, together with two dollars per diem to each of said commissioners, for and during the time they shall be necessarily employed in running said line, shall be paid in equal proportions by the said counties of Huntingdon and Mifflin, by the commissioners of the said counties, by warrants drawn on the treasurers of their respective counties. Expenses.

SECTION 5. The division line run and marked by the commissioners appointed by an act of Assembly, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, between the counties of Juniata and Perry, shall be as good and valid, as if the same had been run and marked within the time mentioned in said act, viz: On or before the fifteenth June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, duplicate drafts of the same, inserting thereon the courses and distances in words of full length; one of which drafts they shall deposit in each of the prothonotaries offices of the aforesaid counties, which shall thereafter be considered a public record, and certified copies thereof shall be evidence, which drafts shall be so deposited previous to said commissioners receiving any compensation for their services; and on their compliance with this act, the com- Between

missioners under the act aforesaid, shall be paid in the manner directed in the original act.

## A Supplement

To the act entitled "An act relating to counties and townships and county and township officers," passed on the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That nothing contained in the act entitled An act relating to counties and townships and county and township officers, passed on the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, shall be so construed as to repeal any special provision theretofore made by law for the compensation of the commissioners and auditors of the county of Philadelphia.
