An Act

Authorizing a subscription of stock to the Waynesburg, Green Castle and Mercersburg turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor is hereby authorized and required to subscribe for one hundred shares of the stock of said company, in addition to that already subscribed, and to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for one-fourth of said additional stock, one year after the passage of this act, and when two and a half miles of the unfinished part of the said road is completed, and one-fourth of said stock, when two and a half miles more are completed, and the balance when the whole of said road is completed: *Provided,* That before any money shall be drawn from the Treasury, the said company shall give security to the Commonwealth, to be approved by the Governor, for completing the whole of the unfinished part of said road.

An Act

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into by and between Israel Steel and Mary his wife, late Mary Geiger, both of the county of Dauphin, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void and the parties released and discharged from the said contract, Marriage contract between I. and from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully and effectually and absolutely as if they never had been joined in marriage.

The marriage contract entered into between Jacob Oiler, junior, now a convict in the Western Penitentiary, and Mary his wife, is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties respectively released and discharged from the said contract, and from all obligations arising therefrom, as fully and effectually as if they had never been joined in marriage; and the said Mary is hereby constituted the legal guardian of the children of the said marriage.

SECTION 3. The marriage contract entered into between Robert Mears and Lydia Mears, now of Adams county, is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from all the legal duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, effectually and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage: *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to render illegitimate the children of said marriage.
