An Act

Authorizing the laying out of a State road from Bethlehem and Sumneytown road in Lehigh county, to the Bethlehem and Philadelphia road, in Bucks county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Peter Ruch, Abraham Newhard and George Keck of Lehigh county, and Christian Bertels, Solomon Fries, David Drissell of Bucks county, be and are hereby appointed commissioners to view, lay out and mark a State road, beginning at the Bethlehem and Sumneytown road, on the line between Israel and Philip Rumfield and Daniel Cooper's lands, in Lehigh county, to the Bethlehem and Philadelphia road, in Bucks county, at or near the house of Joseph Landis. Commiss'ers.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the said commissioners or a majority of them appointed to view as aforesaid, after having been sworn or affirmed before some justice of the peace, who shall file and preserve the same in his office, to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act with impartiality and fidelity, carefully to view the ground over which the road by them laid out may pass, and lay out the same as near to a straight line between the aforesaid points, as the nature of the ground and circumstances will permit, and so that the vertical departure from a horizontal line shall in no point exceed five degrees, except at the crossing at ravines and streams, where by moderate filling and bridging the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit. And further, it shall be the duty of said commissioners to have due regard to the crossing of waters, the nature of the ground, and damages to private property, and all other circumstances that may affect the route, so that by a judicious combination of them, the route adopted may best pro- Duties enjoined on them.
