

the general meeting of the stockholders, or of choosing the directors for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five: *And provided also*, That the directors chosen that year shall continue in office until an election is holden under the provisions of this supplemental act. <sup>2d Proviso.</sup>

SECTION 3. So much of the fourth section of the aforesaid act as prohibits any individual or corporation from holding at the same time, either directly or indirectly, more than one hundred shares of the said stock of said company, be, and the same is hereby repealed. <sup>Prohibition repealed.</sup>

## A Supplement

To the act entitled An act relating to the organization of the courts of justice, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That all civil causes which were depending in the circuit courts of Allegheny county at the time said court was abolished, and which were restored to the court of Common Pleas of said county, by virtue of the one hundred and sixty-third section of the act entitled, an Act relating to the organization of the courts of justice, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, may at the election of either party, in any of said causes, be transferred to the district court of said county of Allegheny, in the manner hereinafter directed: *Provided*, This act shall not be construed to extend to any of said cases that have been prosecuted to judgment since the said circuit court was abolished. <sup>Civil causes in Allegheny county, how transferred. Proviso.</sup>

SECTION 2. When either party in any cause embraced in the provisions of the first section of this act may wish his cause removed into the said District Court, the said party or his attorney shall file with the prothonotary of the court of Common <sup>Certificates to be filed with prothonotary.</sup>

Proviso.

Pleas of said county of Allegheny, a certificate to that effect, whereupon the said certificate and all recognizances of special bail or other recognizances, together with the writs, pleadings, rules, docket entries and records in such case shall be transmitted into the said District Court, and such case shall then be tried and proceeded in as other cases in said District Court: *Provided*, That no cause shall be so removed within thirty days previous to the commencement of any term of said court of Common Pleas, or during the sitting of said court, at any term for which the case was not down for trial.

### An Act

Authorizing the election of assessor and assistant assessors in the borough of Indiana, in the county of Indiana.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That it shall and may be lawful for the qualified electors of the borough of Indiana, in the county of Indiana, annually hereafter at the court house in the said borough, at the same time and under the same regulations as assessors and assistant assessors are elected in the several townships within this Commonwealth, to elect one assessor and two assistant assessors for said borough, which said assessor and assistant assessors so elected, shall have, use and exercise all and every the same duties, and be subject to all and every the same fines, penalties and forfeitures within the said borough respectively, which are or hereafter shall lawfully be used, had and exercised, or which are or shall be suffered by or imposed upon like officers of the several townships of this commonwealth: and the said borough shall hereafter be separate from the townships of Centre and Washington, in said county, so far as regards the assessment and collection of county and State taxes; and the commissioners of said county shall hereafter appoint annually a collector for
