A Supplement

To the act entitled An act perpetuating and enlarging the corporate powers of the borough of Uniontown in the county of Fayette.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for the inhabitants of the borough of Uniontown, in the county of Fayette, qualified to vote for corporate officers of said borough, on the first Monday of May next, to elect nine persons, qualified as aforesaid, to serve as a town council of said borough, three to serve three years, three two years, and three one year; and annually thereafter, on the first Monday in May, to elect three persons qualified as aforesaid, to serve three years.

SECTION 2. The councilmen so elected, shall have the same powers, be subject to the same responsibilities, and their election shall be subject to the same regulations as is prescribed by the act to which this is a supplement.
