An Act

Granting compensation to George Tripner for a tract of donation land.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to George Tripner of Philadelphia county, or order, two hundred dollars, in full compensation for a tract of donation land to which he is entitled for revolutionary services.

An Act

Authorizing the laying out of a State road from Henry Pearson's mill, in Mercer county, to the Newcastle and Zellenople road, in Beaver county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That William Cairns and James McClane of Beaver county, and John Fisher of Mercer county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to view, lay out and mark a State road, beginning at Henry Pearson's mill, in Mercer county, to intersect the Newcastle and Zellenople road, at or near the bridge over Big run, in Beaver county.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the said commissioners or a majority of them, appointed to view as aforesaid, after having been sworn or affirmed before some justice of the peace, who shall file and preserve the same in his office, to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act, with impartiality and fidelity, carefully to view the ground over which the road by them laid out may pass, and lay out the same as near to a straight line, between the aforesaid points, as the nature of the ground and circumstances will permit, and so that the vertical departure
