Reimburs'ble after 1st July, 1865. *Provided*, That no engagement shall be entered into which shall preclude the Commonwealth from reimbursing the said loan at any time after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

SECTION 6. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized to direct the collectors of tolls on the canals and rail-roads of this Commonwealth to deposit their moneys in such banks as he may from time to time deem expedient.

An Act

To open the streets, roads, lanes and alleys in a certain portion of the township of Moyamensing and for fixing the lines and descents of the water courses of all the streets, roads, lanes and alleys in said township, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That Jacob J. Snyder, James Graham and Andrew Kilpatrick, citizens of the township of Moyamensing and county of Philadelphia, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, who or any two of whom taking to their assistance a competent surveyor, shall have full power and authority, and are hereby enjoined and required to survey the streets, lanes, alleys and roads already laid out, and within the southern part of the said township, commencing at the south side of Federal street at its intersection with Passyunk road, continuing along the south eastern boundary of said township to its intersection with Moyamensing road along the eastern side of said road to Buck lane, along the said Buck lane to the western boundary of said township, thence to its intersection with Federal street aforesaid,

thence along the south side of said Federal street to the place of beginning; and also to lay out such other streets, roads, lanes and alleys within the above described portion of the said township of Moyamensing, as they shall deem necessary for the convenience and accommodation of the inhabitants thereof; and it shall be the duty of the said commissioners after having made such survey, and laid out such streets, lanes, alleys and roads as they shall deem proper as aforesaid, to make or cause to be made, a correct draft or plan thereof, with every explanation necessary for the perfect understanding of the same, and return it to the court of Quarter Sessions for the county of Philadelphia, and it shall be the duty of the clerk of said court to receive and file the said draft or plan in his office for public inspection and examination, and to give public notice in at least two of the daily papers published in the city of Philadelphia, that on a certain day to be appointed by the court, the said court will hear any objections that may be made thereto, by any of the freeholders residing or having real estate in the said township, who shall consider themselves aggrieved, and the said court shall at any time appointed adjudge and determine whether the same shall be fully and finally established, and whether any and what alteration shall be made therein, and shall direct the said draft or plan with such alterations as shall be made, to be recorded, and from thenceforth all the streets, lanes, alleys and roads so approved shall be forever thereafter deemed, adjudged and taken public highways.

SECTION 2. In case of the death, resignation or refusal to serve of any of the said commissioners, the court of Quarter Sessions shall appoint one or more proper person or persons to supply his or their place or places from time to time until the end of this act shall be fully answered, which person or persons so to be appointed shall have the same powers as if he or they were named in this act.

SECTION 3. The said commissioners shall be allowed the sum of two dollars for each and every day they shall be employed in performing the duties by this act required, and also their reasonable costs and charges in procuring the surveys and drafts herein before directed to be made.

SECTION 4. The said commissioners having first settled their accounts with three of the aldermen of the county of Philadelphia, shall be entitled to draw orders on the board of commissioners of the township of Moyamensing, for their said expenses and allowances, who are hereby required and enjoined to pass the amount of such orders, payable by the treasurer of said township, who shall be allowed the same in the settlement of his accounts.

SECTION 5. *And whereas* the public convenience will be at present answered by the certain knowledge where and in what manner such streets, lanes, alleys and roads will in future run, but it will not be necessary immediately to lay all of them open,

in order therefore to provide for the opening of the same from time to time as the increasing improvements shall require: Therefore, The remedy by petition to the court of Quarter Sessions shall be in full force in this portion of the said township, subject to the same rules and regulations that govern this mode in other parts, and other districts in the county of Philadelphia. And the owners of ground through which such streets, lanes, alleys, &c. pass are to be indemnified in the same manner as in similar cases in the county of Philadelphia aforesaid. And all acts now in force in the portion of the township already laid out and improved regulating the width of public highways, and their regulations by surveyors, shall be extended to and be in full force in the above described part or portion of the township of Moyamensing aforesaid.

SECTION 6. The filling up, regulating and paving of footways in the foregoing described part or portion of the said township of Moyamensing shall be subject to the same acts as are now or may hereafter be in force in the other and more populated portions of the said township.

SECTION 7. In all streets, lanes and alleys heretofore laid out and appropriated to public use, or to be laid out under this act or by order of the court of Quarter Sessions as aforesaid, within the said township in which the lines and water courses have not been surveyed, ascertained, fixed and established, Alexander W. Reed, John D. Neff and Isaac Shubert, citizens of the township aforesaid, shall be and they are hereby empowered as commissioners for that purpose, to employ one or more surveyor or surveyors, and cause a regulation to be made of the lines and descents of the water courses thereof, and the distances from the sides of the said streets, lanes, alleys and roads of all and every the gutters, natural water courses and common sewers, and to fix and ascertain the same as they may think proper: *Provided*, That such regulation shall in all cases conform in their connecting points with the regulations of the water courses of all streets, roads, lanes and alleys heretofore fixed and established: *And provided also*, That when the lines and descents of the water courses in such streets, roads, lanes or alleys as aforesaid, have been so regulated and fixed, plans thereof shall be made and laid before the board of commissioners of the said township, at a special meeting for that purpose, to be held; and if two-thirds of the said commissioners approve thereof, the president shall thereupon certify such approbation, and the plan with such certificate annexed shall be lodged in the office of the clerk of the court of Quarter Sessions of the county of Philadelphia; and the said regulation for the lines and descents of the water courses of such streets, roads, lanes and alleys shall thereon be and forever remain unalterable.

Compensation extended to commissioners performing like duties, &c.

SECTION 8. The provisions of the third and fourth sections of an act for compensating and defraying the expenses of the commissioners named in the first section for opening the streets;

roads, lanes and alleys in a certain portion of the township of Moyamensing, shall be extended to the commissicners performing like duties in the regulating of the lines and descents of the water courses in the said township.

SECTION 9. It shall be lawful for the commissioners of Southwark, whenever a majority of them shall deem it expedient to cause conduit pipes to be laid in such streets, lanes and alleys of said district for the supply of wholesome water as they or a majority of them may think necessary, and collect the expenses of such pipes in the same manner, and with the same privileges and by the same legal remedies as is provided in the act entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled An act to incorporate the district of Southwark, passed the twenty-eighth March, eighteen hundred and twenty-five.

SECTION 10. The commissioners and inhabitants of the district of Southwark, are hereby authorized to purchase when they deem it expedient, a lot of ground in said district, to be kept open as a public square forever in the same manner that the public squares in the city of Philadelphia are kept open.
