

SECTION 12. The location of the office for the transaction of the business of the corporation shall be west of Broad street, in the city of Philadelphia; and if at any time it shall appear to the Legislature, that the privileges hereby granted are injurious to the public welfare, the power to repeal this act shall not on any condition be denied or impaired, but such repeal shall not affect any engagements to which the said company may have become a party previously thereto, and the said company shall have a reasonable time to bring their accounts to a final settlement and determination: *Provided*, That the said company shall be subject to such provisions and regulations as the Legislature may at any time enact, for taxing the insurance companies of this Commonwealth.

An Act

Authorizing the connexion of the Danville and Pottsville Rail-road with the Susquehanna river at Sunbury, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president and managers of the Danville and Pottsville rail-road company, be and they are hereby authorized to connect their basin in the borough of Sunbury, with the Susquehanna river by lock or otherwise, as they may deem most advantageous to the company.

SECTION 2. All the rights, powers, privileges and immunities conferred upon the Little Schuylkill navigation rail-road and coal company, in relation to its track and its vicinity, by the first section of the act entitled A supplement to the act entitled An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate a company to make a lock navigation on the east branch of the river Schuylkill, called Little Schuylkill, passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and by the second section of an act entitled A supplement to an act entitled An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate a company to make a

lock navigation on the east branch of the river Schuylkill, called Little Schuylkill, passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven, be and the same are hereby extended to the Little Schuylkill and Susquehanna rail-road company, in relation to its track and the vicinity thereof.

Increase of
capital stock.

SECTION 3. If any further increase of capital stock be deemed necessary by the stockholders beyond the amount required and authorized by the act, entitled An act to incorporate the Little Schuylkill and Susquehanna rail-road company, to make the said rail-road and carry into full effect objects of the said company, according to the true intent and meaning of the said act, its supplements and of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the president managers and company, at a stated or special meeting convened for the purpose, to increase the number of shares, so that the capital stock of the said company shall not exceed eight hundred thousand dollars, and to receive and demand the moneys for shares so subscribed in like manner and under like penalties as are provided by the original subscription, or as shall be provided for by their by-laws.

Time for

SECTION 4. The time for commencing the said rail-road shall be and the same is hereby extended for the term of two years from the date hereof, and the time for completing the said rail-road shall be and the same is hereby extended for the term of six years from and after the date of this act.

SECTION 5. The Rock Cabin and Tangascootack rail-road company, have and enjoy all the powers, rights and privileges vested by this act in the Little Schuylkill and Susquehanna rail-road company.

An Act

Authorizing a temporary loan for the use of the Commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor is hereby authorized to negotiate a*
