

Temporary loan on the credit of the Commonwealth not to exceed the sum of seventy-four thousand four hundred and forty dollars, at an interest not exceeding five per cent. per annum, with any bank or banks, corporation, individual or individuals, as in his opinion may be most advantageous: *Provided*, The said money or any part thereof shall be required to meet the appropriations made during the present session, to complete the Eastern and Western Penitentiaries, the money so borrowed to be repaid to the lender or lenders, within twelve months from the date of this act, in such manner as may be hereafter provided for by the Legislature.

An Act

Relative to Lafayette College, and to public education in the city of Lancaster.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That it shall and may be lawful for the trustees of Lafayette College, whenever they shall deem it necessary, to supply the places of any members of their board residing in the vicinity of the institution, who shall for twelve months or more, fail to attend the meetings of the board of trustees of which meetings they shall have been notified.

SECTION 2. The act to provide for the education of children at the public expense in the city and incorporated boroughs of the county of Lancaster, passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, and the supplement thereto, passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, be and they are hereby revived, and put in full force and operation as though the said acts had never been repealed; and that the act entitled An act to establish a general system of education by common schools, passed the first day of

SECTION 3. The commissioners of Lancaster county be and they are hereby authorized to pay to William Kirkpatrick, his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, the purchase money for a lot of ground in the city of Lancaster, purchased from him by the directors of the first section of the second school district in said city, and to take a conveyance for the same, and hold the same for the use of the directors of the first section of the second school district, in the city of Lancaster aforesaid, so long as the building erected on said lot of ground shall be used by the said directors for the purposes of education; and when the same shall cease to be so used, the said lot of ground and buildings thereon erected, shall be vested in the commissioners of the county of Lancaster for the use of the said county.

An Act

Relating to the courts of Armstrong county, and to authorize the courts of Quarter Sessions of Washington and Allegheny counties to name and to change the names of townships.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act the June and December terms of the court of Common Pleas and Quarter Sessions of Armstrong county, shall commence on the second Monday of June and December and continue two weeks, unless otherwise ordered by the court at the preceding term: *Provided,* That when the court shall be of opinion that two weeks, as aforesaid, are unnecessary, said court shall commence on the third Mondays of June and December as heretofore.
