An Act

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Adam Reichenbach, George Deily and Jacob Wild, of Lehigh county; James Nunemacher, of Northampton county; Philip Swartz and Michael Frederic, of Schuylkill county; James Robinson and Lawrence Konkle, of Beaver county; William Kelly and Jacob Duck, of Centre county; Mathias Derr, of Lebanon county; John Fauscy of Columbia county; George Shambaugh, of Perry county, and Mary Johnson, of Fayette county; Joseph Gannon, of Tioga county, State of New York; Samuel Quigley, Mary Fisher and John Turner, of Beaver county; Maria Elizabeth Northstern and Leonard Hartrauft, of Schuylkill county; Mary Wilson and Mary Holgate, of Philadelphia county; William Johnston, of Adams county; Vincent Stevens and David Shull, of Bedford county; John Hallman, Margaret Morer, Catharine Drehs and Eleanor Bean, of Montgomery county; John Brown, of Armstrong county; Casper Zegar and Philip Gohn, of York county; Stephenson, William Stephenson, of Franklin county; Peter P. Gehret, forty dollars to each immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

The foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity to the existing laws.

An Act

To alter the time of holding the courts in Mercer, Jefferson, Warren, McKean and Pettee counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act of Assembly which requires the courts in Mercer county to commence on the fourth Monday of September in each year, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the said courts shall hereafter commence on the third Monday in October of each year.

SECTION 2. From and after the first day of September next, the courts in the county of Warren shall be held on the first Mondays of March, June, September and December. The courts of Jefferson county shall be held on the second Mondays of
