SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is authorized and required to pay to John Overdorff, of Berks county; Daniel Kautz, of Perry county; Henry McCarthy, of Huntingdon county; Henry White, of Lancaster county; John Lose, of Northumberland county; Joshua Heidler, of Adams county; John Gardner and Matthias Fetterhoff, of Adams county; Peter Harder, of Columbia county; Michael Gentzel, of Columbia county, and Michael Kinttel, of Berks county; soldiers of the revolutionary war, and Maria Elizabeth Weaver, of Schuylkill county, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, a gratuity of forty dollars each immediately, in full for their revolutionary services. The foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity to the existing laws.

An Act

To alter the time of holding the courts in Mercer, Jefferson, Warren, McKean and Pettee counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act of Assembly which requires the courts in Mercer county to commence on the fourth Monday of September in each year, be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the said courts shall hereafter commence on the third Monday in October of each year.

SECTION 2. From and after the first day of September next, the courts in the county of Warren shall be held on the first Mondays of March, June, September and December. The courts of Jefferson county shall be held on the second Mondays of

February, May, September and December. The courts in McKean county shall be held on the Mondays next following the courts in Jefferson county: and the courts in Potter county on the Mondays next following the courts in McKean county.

An Act

To vest in Joseph Whitacre and Benjamin Jones, trustees of Rachel and Leah Ann, illegitimate children of Daniel Norwood, deceased, and Hannah Norwood, certain real estate, and to authorize the sale of the same.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the right, title and interest of, in and to two certain tracts of land situate in Muncy township, in the county of Lycoming, containing together one hundred and five acres or thereabouts, of which Daniel Norwood late of the said county, deceased, died seized, is hereby vested one moiety in Joseph Whitacre and Benjamin Jones, in trust for Rachel and Leah Ann, illegitimate children of the said Daniel, who are of non sane memory, and one moiety in Hannah Norwood the widow of the said Daniel, and the said Joseph Whitacre and Benjamin Jones, trustees as aforesaid, and the said Hannah are hereby authorized to sell and convey the same in fee simple, but before such sale the said Joseph and Benjamin shall give security to be approved by the Orphans' Court of Lycoming county for the faithful performance of their trust, and the application of the proceeds of one half part of the said land to the use and benefit of the said Rachel and Leah Ann: *And provided,* That this Proviso. act shall not interfere with or divest the rights of third persons,
