Resolution

Relative to the election of United States Senator.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That for the purpose of filling the vacancy in the United States Senate, occasioned by the resignation of William Wilkins, the members of both Houses will assemble in the chamber of the House of Representatives on Saturday the sixth instant at the hour of twelve, and then and there elect a Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States, and that the election be held and conducted in the manner prescribed by the act entitled "An act to prescribe the times, places and manner of choosing Senators to represent this State in the Senate of the United States," passed the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and two, provided that the nominations made by either House shall be reported to the other House at least two days previous to the said election.

Resolution

Relative to the Meadville Arsenal.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the occupancy of such part of the State Arsenal, situate at Meadville, in the county of Crawford, as is not in use be, and the same is hereby temporally granted to the trustees of Alle-

gheny College in said county, for the purposes of education as connected with said institution: *Provided*, That the Adjutant General shall by writing addressed to the said trustees, designate what part of the building shall necessarily be retained for the storage and preservation of such public property as is at this time, or as may from time to time hereafter be deposited there: *And provided further*, That the possession of the same, shall be re-delivered to the Adjutant General at any time he shall think proper, within fifteen days after he shall demand the same: *And provided further*, That the trustees of said college, shall be accountable to the Commonwealth for any damages which may be done to the said Arsenal, or public property deposited in the same, in consequence of its being so occupied by the students.
